### **Administration:**

BLDE (DU), has deployed campus wide optical fibre based digitally integrated intranet at a cost of 70 lakhs connecting academic and administrative office, departments, Central Library, Lecture Halls, Hostels and 10 Gbps Optical Backbone to Teaching Hospital. All the Optical Fibre in the campus is connected in server room with 2-L3(Layer-3) Data Centre Switch or Core Switch to provide high-throughput, high-performance packet and frame movers. Packets and frames are simply moved from one core switch to another core switch, and eventually down to the next tier of switches.

### **Academic Management Information System (MIS)**

### **BEST PRACTICES**



**Title:** Raspberry Pi – Camera system: Cost effective Open Source 3D printed answer to convert any microscope to a teaching microscope.

**Objectives:**

To augment the teaching practices in Pathology by using cost effective open source technologies.

**The Context:**

Pathology is the branch of Medicine which characterizes the disease at the tissue level and at times to the cellular level. The present-day norm of teaching Pathology is digitalized and done as a combination of the High Definition LED panels or projectors, custom made manufacturer provided HD camera, adaptor and teaching trinocular head microscopes. But even with the digitization and rapidly advancing technologies, the cost of the OEM cameras and adapters is still high which amounts to a minimum of Rs.1,15,000 for a single microscope. With upgradation of the display panels and projectors to best possible resolutions, the high-resolution camera has become the missing piece to utilize these display devices to their full potential. The utilization of the open source technologies and 3D printing had helped us in achieving this digitization at fraction of the cost at a mere Rs.6000 and an additional advantage of portable camera system which can convert any binocular microscope to a teaching microscope.

**The Practice:**

Raspberry Pi is the credit card sized, single board computer which is an open source initiative. Pairing it with the Raspberry Pi camera, a Sony IMX219 8MP sensor, HD (30fps) fixed focus device which delivers a high definition image to the LED panels available in the University at histopathology and cytology sections. The adapter which aligns the Pi camera system to the eye piece objective of any compound microscope is an open source design which enables this flexibility.

**Evidence of Success:**

By utilizing this highly cost-effective system, we have achieved the ability to teach Pathology in high definition streaming of the microscopy images. in all the sections, gallery halls and practical halls for both the undergraduate and postgraduate teaching programs. This ability to have such flexibility and converting any microscope to a teaching microscope was achieved at a fraction of the cost of the OEM systems. With the inbuilt Wi-Fi protocol, the camera provides the option to explore the ability to stream the microscope images over the LAN network of the University which is being tested.

**Problems encountered and Resources required:**

With the help of Raspberry Pi global help forums over the internet, free to use resources and how to guides enabled us in achieving our goal and successfully implementing the project in the University.

**Notes:**

Technology is being rapidly interwoven into various teaching practices of Medicine and it need not always be a cost prohibitive forbidden fruit. Just by embracing open source philosophy the benefits can be even more rewarding and gains wide spread utility.
