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Dr. R. S. Mudhol, Dr. Jaydeb Ray, Dr. G. S. Narashetty, Dr. Tejaswini Vallabha, Vice Principal, Dr. B. R. Yelikar, Co-ordinator, IQAC and a few of Faculty Members could not attend the meeting and were granted leave of absence.

Agenda:

1. Confirmation of the minutes of the 27th meeting:

The Chairman of the Council has drawn the attention of the Members towards two deferred items viz. 3 (m) regarding cancellation of Ph. D. registration of 10 students and 3 (n) regarding withdrawal of recognition as Ph. D. guide, of those faculty members who either resigned, retired or died. The matter was deliberated and discussed in context to UGC Ph. D. Regulations, 2016 and University rules.

It was resolved to cancel the registration of 10 candidates and withdraw the recognition of the enlisted guides.

3. For Discussion and Decision:

a. Proceedings of Board of Examinations (BoE):

The Controller of Examinations presented the highlights and important decisions of BoE with regard to Question paper work, Digital Evaluation, Revision of rates for exam valuation work.

Resolution: Accepted and approved.

b. Proceedings of IQAC:

On behalf of IQAC Co-ordinator, Dr. S. P. Choukimath, Chairman of Criteria – I of NAAC, presented the proceedings of the 14th IQAC meeting held on 18th April, 2019 and highlighted important decisions pertaining to quarterly progress report presentation by Criteria Committee Chairpersons, timeline for the second cycle of the NAAC, strategies for optimal implementation of new Manual of Health Sciences for Universities, revision of Curricular of PG, UG, Pre. Ph. D., value added courses. Also, the efforts put into enhance the perception of the Institute, in context to Accreditation and Ranking.

Dr. Shiva Halli enquired to know the concept of perception of the Institute. The Chairman & Vice-Chancellor responded to the query and explained about the perception and mode of enhancing the perception of constituent College and University.

Dr. G. Pradeep Kumar, Vice-Chancellor, SDUAHE & External Member opined that patients shall be the ambassadors, look for advertisement / publicity of hospital services to enhance the perception of Institution. He suggested that presentation in State / National Conferences by faculty by way of oral presentation (podium) also adds to Institutional perception.

Dr. Shekhar Patil, External Member opined that oncology / radiation therapy, tertiary care services shall be included in Superspeciality section of hospital. He himself volunteered to visit our hospital one day a month. This will boost the perception.

Prof. Shiva Halli volunteers to help for National Collaborations, as he has linkages with National Institute of Public Health in regard to Institutional perception.

Resolution: Accepted and approved.

c. Important decisions of Board of Studies meeting:

The Registrar presented the highlights of Board of Studies and important decisions of all departments, including major decisions of revision of PG curriculum.

Resolution: Accepted and approved.

d. Revision of curriculum of Post Graduate course:

Dr. Vidya Patil, Member of Curriculum Committee has briefed the Council about the revision of the Post Graduate curriculum. She highlighted the important changes made in the curriculum as per the MCI guidelines.

The competencies to be acquired by the postgraduate students were ascribed significance and accordingly the teaching methods changed into more skill based teaching learning sessions. Communication skills were also given importance.

Prof. Shiva Halli appreciated the inclusion in PG curricula of social / basic aspects for attitudinal changes required for students.

Dr. Pradeep Kumar, VC, SDUHE observed that attitude cannot be taught but has to be imbibed.

Responding to the observation, the Chairman of the Council explained the efforts being put in by the University to inculcate attitudinal additional changes in the students when they work for programs.

Resolution: The house agreed that honing and training of skills of the “future specialists” is important, Accepted, Approved and recommended to BoM.

e. Curriculum for Ph. D. Entrance Examination:

Prof. Kusal K. Das, Member of Ph. D. Committee briefed Council about the framing of the Curriculum for Ph. D. Entrance Examination by all concerned departments as per Regulations and the same may be implemented from the Academic Year 2019-20 on approval of the Council.

Resolution: Accepted and approved and recommended to BoM.

f. Examination results of UG / PG and other courses January – 2019:

The Controller of Examinations shared the Council details of results of various examinations held in the month of January – February, 2019.

a. Recognition of Ph. D. Guide:

For facilitating the Ph.D. research work of the Ph. D. students, 02 Faculty Members of Department of Community Medicine were recognized as Ph. D. Guides and notified their names.

Resolution: Ratified.

5. For Information:

a. Conversion of 16 nos. of PG Diploma seats to PG Degree seats by MCI:

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the Council that the Medical Council of India (MCI) has allowed conversion of the Post Graduate Diploma Course Seats into corresponding Degree Seats prospectively i.e. from the Academic Session 2019-20, by the vide Notification No.MCI-23(1)/10(A)/2018-Med/184147, dt. 28-02-2019, subject to affiliation of by the University for additional PG seats of the OGBY, Orthopedics, Pediatrics, Anaesthesiology, ENT and Pathology.

Resolution: Noted.

b. Visit to Texas Tech University:

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor briefed the Council regarding his visit to Texas Tech University, El Paso along with Prof. Kusal K. Das and had a discussion with the University Officials regarding MoU between two Universities for establishment of 'Cancer Research Centre' at BLDE(DU).

The Dean of Graduate Medical School, Dr. Raj had in depth discussion with the Vice-Chancellor and assured full cooperation and support to have a mutual scientific bond between both the Universities.

Resolution: Noted with appreciation.

c. Co-hosted the International 7th Chronic Hypoxia Symposium – 2019 at Bolivia:

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor has informed the Council that the BLDE(DU) was invited by High Altitude Pulmonary and Pathology Institute to co-host the 7th Chronic Hypoxia Symposium at

High Altitude Pulmonary and Pathology Institute, Zubieta University, La Paz, Bolivia. Armada Boliviana (Bolivian Navy) and Universite de Laval, Canada were the other co organizers.

He informed the symposium was held from February 25 to March 02, 2019 at capital city of Bolivia La Paz.

d. Visit to reputed Higher Educational Institutions of Karnataka and Maharashtra:

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor informed the Council that the team comprising 17 members visited the reputed Higher Educational Institutions of Karnataka viz. Yenepoya (DU), A. J. Shetty Medical Collge, Mangalore, Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Manipal, NITTE (DU), St. Johns Medical College, Bengaluru, M. S. Ramaiaha Medical College, Bengaluru, SDM Medical College, Dharwad and KAHAR, Belagavi.

He also informed that with additional members the team visited to Bharati Vidyapeeth and Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune and collected the information about the administration, academic, research, teaching, evaluation process & other activities of the Institutions and discussed with Hon'ble Chancellor, steps will be taken to implementation of programmes/ work, which will be helpful to our University & College.

e. MCI new guidelines regarding increase of 10 percent seats of PG seats for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) candidates:

The Registrar informed the Council that the MCI has sent circular regarding implementation of reservation of 10% seats in Postgraduate(PG) course for Economically Weaker Sections (ESWS) candidates by enhancing of PG seats in the existing Medical Colleges / Institutes u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2020-21.

The Council discussed the matter in detail and advised to abide by the MCI Guidelines.

6. Any other matter with permission of the Chair.

a. Proceedings of 10th meeting of Research Grant Committee:

The Registrar briefed the Council regarding proceedings of 11th meeting of Research Grant Committee. The Committee received 13 research proposals for University funding the Chairman has suggested some modifications in the proposal and total 35 STS UG project were submitted to ICMR for approval from the 06 proposals were acted and remaining 29 proposals were to be funded by the University not more than Rs. 10, 000/- per project.

Resolution: Approved and Accepted.

b. MCI Regulations regarding Revised PG Teacher : Student Ratio:

The Registrar has informed the Council that the MCI has issued the notice that all Medical Colleges/Postgraduate Medical Institutes/ Concerned Health and Other Universities / Director Medical Education and Secretary in charge of Medical Education / Health of all the States / Union Territories that clause 12 under the heading "Number of Postgraduate students to be admitted" in Post Graduate Regulations, 2000 of MCI has been approved for amendment, which includes revised PG teacher : student ratio and directed to fulfill the all the criteria as prescribed under MCI Regulations, may submit the application accordingly within 15th May, 2019.

Resolution: Noted.
