BOS meeting in Physiology was held on 21-03-2019 (Thursday) between 9.30am to 11am in the chamber of HOD of Physiology.

The gist of proceedings during the meeting are as follows:

- Minutes of previous meeting (held on 09-10-2018) were confirmed.
- List of Examiners (UG and PG) in Physiology was reviewed and accepted.
- Lists of Ph.D and PG guides in Physiology were reviewed and accepted.
- Draft of Pre Ph.D. course work was reviewed and accepted.
- Progress reports of Ph.D scholars were reviewed and accepted.

Question Papers vs Results:

- 9 Students appeared for University Examination in Physiology in January 2019. Out of which 02 Students belonged to 2012batch, 01 Student belonged to 2015 batch and 06 Students belonged to 2017batch. 06Students from 2017batch got through the Examination. Remaining 03 Students who did not appear for the exam are supposed to appear for University Exam in July 2019. External Member was very happy about University Results of I MBBS in Physiology. As per the opinion of External BOS Member, University Physiology theory question papers were appropriately designed.
- ▶ Performance of the Students of I MBBS 2018-19batch was also discussed. In 2nd I.A. Examinations, Out of 150 Students, 147 appeared for the exam. Out of which, 110 Students passed, 25 Students scored in the range of 35 to 44 % and another 15 Students scored less

He suggested to counsel the students and help them in improving their attendance and performance. The concerned mentors should give proper guidance to vulnerable students to bring up to the level of expectation.

The draft of modified PG Syllabus was discussed and fully accepted by the external member. It was prepared keeping in view of competency based medical education for the PG course as per latest MCI guidelines.

Modified draft of UG Curriculum as by the CBME- MCI. Pattern of Examination according to the modified Basic Curriculum CBME was discussed and accepted.
