Dr.B.R. Yelikar, Prof and HOD, welcomed all BOS members and introduced agenda of the meeting

- 1. Confirmation of the minutes of the previous BOS meeting: members confirmed the minutes of previous BOS meeting.
- 2. Curriculum of allied courses : No changes.
- 3. **New courses:** Dr.B.R Yelikar told that the proposal for the Postgraduation in transfusion medicine will be taken after the PG inspection for increase of seats. Dr. Malathi suggested that BscMLT course of 3 years duration can be started. She also gave a brief idea of the course being conducted at KMIO, Bengaluru
- 4. **Review of existing courses**: Various Changes made in the UG curriculum were highlighted by Dr. Vijayalaxmi. The members approved for reduction in the numbers of didactic lectures, incorporation of active learning methods like case discussion, problem based learning and integrated teaching. (Details at the end)

The PG curriculum changes were highlighted by Dr. R.M. Poteker. (Details at the end)

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SHRI. B. M. PATIL MEDICAL COLLEGE, HOSPITAL AND RESEARCH CENTRE Dr. Malathi suggested that at least one CPC (clinicopathological correlation) should be conducted for the undergraduates every year,. All the members agreed for the same.

Dr. Ramdas Naik suggested that work based assessment of the postgraduate students by section incharge should be done and report should be submitted to the HOD. "He also told that instead of conducting special stain procedure in the PG exas, stained slides should be given for interpretation. He also told that instead of block cutting exercise problematic sections should be given for interpretation. All the members agreed. Dr. Malathi suggested that integrated teaching for PG students can be done with common topics involving major clinical departments.

- 5. Review of PhD courses: Review of PhD programme was done. Both registered candidates are submitting their quarterly progress reports.
- 6. Recognition of PhD guide/PG teacher: Dr. R.M. P[otekar and Dr. Surekha Hippargi had applied previously for PhD guide and both have been approved as PhD guides.
- 7. Question Paper V/s Result Analysis:

The members felt that the long essay type question (Clinical case) of both the papers were difficult. Everyone felt that atleast one pathological finding as a clue should be included in the questions.

To improve the results, Dr. Malathi suggested that instead of two problem based long essay questions only one problem based question should be included. Dr. Ramdas Naik felt that the long essay, short essay questions should be given to thew paper setters.
